

SITUATION:

We have a 2-parent case in which one of the parents is both employed and timed out. The other parent is still receiving assistance under the SSP/MOE program along with the children.

QUESTIONS:

1. Do the timed out parent's hours of employment count toward the AU's WTW participation requirement?
2. Is the aided parent's WTW participation requirement 35 hours per week or 30?

ANSWERS:

1. No, the hours of employment for the timed out person do not count toward the AU's WTW participation.
2. The aided parent's WTW requirement continues to be 35 hours per week.
