SUBJECT: FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR (FFY) 2013 EMERGENCY FOOD
ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (EFAP) FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE
ALLOCATION

The purpose of this letter is to provide food banks with their final EFAP administrative allocation for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2013. On March 26, 2013, the President signed the Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act of 2013, which provided funding for EFAP administrative related costs associated with the storage, handling, and distribution of United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) commodities. California's share of the administrative funding is \$6,158,505. As allowed under federal law, California has elected to convert ten percent of the USDA commodity funds into administrative funds, which will provide an additional \$3,589,621 for EFAP administrative costs. California's total administrative funding of \$9,748,126 is allocated as displayed in the attached chart titled "FFY 2013 Emergency Food Assistance Program Final Allocation".

Via this letter, the California Department of Social Services is allocating the administrative funding in accordance with EFAP Policy and Procedure Manual Section 3. Food banks must follow the reimbursement claiming process provided in EFAP Policy and Procedure Manual Section 17 to request reimbursement for the expenses directly related to administering EFAP.
