CALIFORNIA WORK OPPORTUNITY AND RESPONSIBILITY TO  
KIDS PROGRAM

This letter notifies counties of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-17 Single Allocation (SA) for the California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) program. A total of \$1.86 billion in federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Funds and General Fund is available based on the Budget Act of 2016.

The CalWORKs SA also includes funding (or increased funding) for the following policy changes: Maximum Family Grant (MFG) Repeal, Homeless Assistance Program (HAP), CalWORKs Child Care Regional Market Rate (RMR) Increase to 75th Percentile of 2014 and Hold Harmless and CalWORKs Child Care License-Exempt Increase to 70 Percent.

**CalWORKs Eligibility Administration, WTW Employment Services, Stage One Child Care and Cal-Learn**

Attachment I displays a summary of the CalWORKs SA funds for the following program components: Eligibility Administration, Welfare-to-Work (WTW) Employment Services, Stage One Child Care and Cal-Learn. Attachment II details the breakdown of the CalWORKs SA components. The funding for these components reflects the administration and services costs of the CalWORKs program, as well as direct services delivery costs.

The California Department of Social Services collaborated with the County Welfare Directors Association on the distribution of the \$1.86 billion for CalWORKs

Eligibility Administration, WTW Employment Services, Stage One Child Care and Cal-Learn components as follows:

- Since funding for the FY 2016-17 Eligibility Administration, WTW Employment Services, Stage One Child Care and Cal Learn components are less than the FY 2015-16 components, the difference is distributed based on a percent to total of each county's FY 2015-16 total allocated funds for CalWORKs Eligibility Administration, WTW Employment Services, Stage One Child Care and Cal-Learn.

Please note the flexibility to redirect funds between the CalWORKs SA and Mental Health and Substance Abuse sunsetted June 30, 2014. The Mental Health and Substance Abuse allocation resumed as a separate allocation per [CFL NO.16/17-15 dated September 8, 2016](#).

### **MFG Repeal**

In accordance with the 2016 Budget Act, no applicant or recipient will be denied cash aid for a child born during a period in which the family was receiving aid. This rule applies to children currently designated as MFG, as well as future children born to the Assistance Unit. Children with MFG status will no longer be excluded by law, and their needs must be included in the cash aid grant effective January 1, 2017, if all other conditions of eligibility are met.

### **HAP**

The 2016 Budget Act lifts the once-in-a-lifetime restriction on receipt of temporary and permanent homeless assistance. Effective January 1, 2017, assistance through HAP will be available once every twelve months. The allowable limits for temporary homeless assistance (16 days per year) and daily rate for temporary housing (\$65 per day) remain unchanged.

### **CalWORKs Child Care RMR Increase to 75<sup>th</sup> Percentile of 2014 and Hold Harmless**

Reimbursement rates for providers of CalWORKs Stage One Child Care services are based on the RMR. The 2016 Budget Act authorized the reimbursement ceilings to change to the 75th percentile of the 2014 RMR Survey effective January 1, 2017.

As the change from the current RMR rates to the updated 75th percentile of the 2014 RMR Survey would result in a decrease for certain rate settings, the 2016 Budget Act also allows reimbursement rates to remain at the higher of the updated rates or the current rates (which are the 85th percentile of the 2009 RMR survey with a 10.11 percent deficit, increased by 4.5 percent).

### **CalWORKs Child Care License-Exempt Increase to 70 Percent**

The 2016 Budget Act increases license-exempt child care reimbursement rates from 65 to 70 percent of the Family Child Care Home Rate, effective January 1, 2017.

### **Statewide Contract Funding**

San Francisco County has volunteered to manage the Statewide Contract Funding on behalf of all the counties. A proportional amount of funding was redirected to San Francisco County from all counties based on a percent to total basis.

### **Program Codes (PCs)**

Attachment III provides a complete listing of PCs available for claiming to the CalWORKs SA. Expenditures charged against these PCs are tracked against the CalWORKs SA ledger on the quarterly County Expense Claim.
