This letter is to inform counties that the United States Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) has revised the Income Eligibility Standards and Allotments Guide. Under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), the maximum and minimum allotments for each area remain unchanged from Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2009.

As of October 1, 2009, the shelter expense deduction increased from \$446 to \$459 for new applications and re-certifications occurring on or after the above date. As a result of the increase in the shelter expense deduction, the disaster gross income limit, which includes income and liquid resources, will also increase. County staff will need to update their Disaster Food Stamp Handbooks by obtaining the current income and eligibility standards at:
