The purpose of this letter is to provide further clarification of the All-County Information Notice 1-100-80 previously sent to you regarding the California Foster Parent training workshops to be held in Sacramento, California on October 17, 18, and 19, 1980.


It is the policy of the Department of Social Services that the training of foster parents is an allowable training expense as specifically identified in the Title XX Regulations. In accordance with federal and state regulations costs matchable as training expenditures for foster parents include travel and education costs. If the county chooses to reimburse foster parents for other workshop related expenditures such as per diem, such costs must be claimed as Title XX administrative costs within the limitation of the counties' Other County Social Service (OCSS) allocation. The allowable training costs are to be reported on the Administrative Expense Claim, DFA 325.2, Group IV, Staff Development, 2, Other Operating. The administrative costs such as per diem are to be claimed on the DFA 325.3, Group III, A, Direct Costs for Social Services, Section 2, Operating Costs, and showing the appropriate Title XX Code, C.24.

The training at this workshop would be geared to the "special needs" as indicated in CASP and information disseminated in the workshops should proceed in this direction.
