SUBJECT: REDUCTION OF TITLE XX REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

REFERENCE: DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES MANUAL OF POLICIES AND PROCEDURES,  
SECTION 26-514, ACIN I-54-82, AND ACIN I-144-81


The Department of Social Services has re-evaluated the Title XX Social Services Reporting Requirement. As a result of this re-evaluation, and to eliminate duplication of data collection, the Title XX report will be further reduced.

Effective with the October-December 1982 report quarter, Protective Services for Children, and In-Home Supportive Services will be eliminated from the SOC 242. In addition, Permanent Placement Services and Family Reunification Services will be eliminated from the SOC 242 effective with the January-March 1983 report quarter.

Thus, only Protective Services for Adults, Out-of-Home Care Services for Adults, Optional Services and the Information and Referral need be reported on the SOC 242 after January 1, 1983. The State will use Forms SOC 291 (Child Protective Services) and SOC 296 (In-Home Supportive Services) and the Foster Care Information System as its sole data source for budgeting and forecasting for those Title XX services no longer collected on Form SOC 242.

A revised Form SOC 242 (11/82) is attached. Additional copies of the Form SOC 242 (11/82) may be ordered in the usual way.

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## SOC 242

### SOCIAL SERVICES PROVIDED TO PRIMARY RECIPIENTS

#### SERVICES COUNTS:

Report each type of mandatory or optional Title XX *Social Service* provided at *any time* during the report period. The type of service may have been received either directly by the *Primary Recipient*, or it may have been provided to another individual on behalf of the Primary Recipient.

If during the report period a Primary Recipient received (1) Protective Services for Adults, (2) In-Home Supportive Services, and (3) an Optional Service, count this individual three times on this form; once under each type of service he or she received during the report period (i.e., the report actually calls for a count of *types of services* received by Primary Recipients or by other individuals on their behalf).

#### INFORMATION & REFERRAL COUNT:

Information and Referral Services may be provided to persons without regard to their income under provisions of Title XX.

Opposite Information and Referral Services, enter the total *number of times I & R service was provided* during the report period. Include the number of times I & R service was provided to Primary Recipients in cases where the referral was for a service not included in your county's plan.

**Information and Referral** - refers to the giving of information about social services provided under Title XX and related service programs by Provider Agencies, and brief assessment (but *not* diagnosis and evaluation) solely for the purpose of facilitating an appropriate referral to those community resources which provide or make available such services.
