SUBJECT: INCOME ELIGIBLE TABLE FOR THE OUT-OF-HOME CARE FOR ADULTS PROGRAM

This letter is to provide you with an updated income eligibility table for determining eligibility for the Out-of-Home Care for Adults Program (OHC-A). In the past, the table was made available through the Title XX Block Grant Preexpenditure Report, but is not in the 1985-86 Report. The figures provided in the first table should be used through June 30, 1986. The second table covers FY 86-87 and should be used starting July 1, 1986.

MPP Section 30-002(h)(1) defines income eligible persons as those persons whose gross annual family income does not exceed 80% of the median family income for California for a family of four, adjusted according to family size. A basic family unit consists of one or more adults and children, if any, related by blood, marriage, or adoption, and residing in the same household. When adults other than spouses reside together, each person shall be considered a separate family. Children living with relatives who are not legally responsible for their care, children who are emancipated minors, and children living under the care of unrelated persons shall also be considered one-person families.

FY 1985-86

California's maximum four-person family income for services eligibility is \$25,642. (Eighty percent of the median income for California for a family of four). The median income for FY 1985-86 is \$32,053 for a family of four and was calculated by applying the California Necessities Index (CNI) cumulatively to the median income figure provided in the 1981-82 Comprehensive Annual Services Program Plan (CASPP).

2-person family	- (68% of \$25,642)	- \$17,436	- \$1453 monthly
3-person family	- (84% of \$25,642)	- \$21,539	- \$1794 monthly
4-person family	- (100% of \$25,642)	- \$25,642	- \$2136 monthly
5-person family	- (116% of \$25,642)	- \$29,745	- \$2478 monthly
6-person family	- (132% of \$25,642)	- \$33,847	- \$2820 monthly

For each additional family member above six persons, add 3 percentage points to the percentage for a family of six.

FY 1986-87

California's maximum four-person family income for services eligibility is \$26,949. (Eighty percent of the median income for California for a family of four). The median income for FY 1986-87 is \$33,687 for a family of four and was calculated by applying the CNI cumulatively to the median income figure provided in the 1981-82 CASPP.

1-person family	- (52% of \$26,949)	- \$14,013	- \$1,167 monthly
2-person family	- (68% of \$26,949)	- \$18,325	- \$1,527 monthly
3-person family	- (84% of \$26,949)	- \$22,637	- \$1,886 monthly
4-person family	- (100% of \$26,949)	- \$26,949	- \$2,245 monthly
5-person family	- (116% of \$26,949)	- \$31,260	- \$2,605 monthly
6-person family	- (132% of \$26,949)	- \$35,572	- \$2,964 monthly

For each additional family member above six persons, add 3 percentage points to the percentage for a family of six.
