TO: ALL COUNTY WELFARE DIRECTORS

SUBJECT: INCOME ELIGIBILITY TABLE FOR THE OUT-OF-HOME CARE FOR ADULTS PROGRAM

This letter is to provide you with an updated income eligibility table for determining eligibility for the Out-of Home Care for Adults Program (OHC-A). The table covers Fiscal Year (FY) 89/90 and should be used starting July 1, 1989.

MPP Section 30-002(h)(1) defines income eligible persons as those persons whose gross annual family income does not exceed 80% of the median family income for California for a family of four, adjusted according to family size. A basic family unit resides in the same household, and consists of one or more children, if any, and adults who are related by blood, marriage including common-law, or adoption. The following are considered one-person families: (1) each unrelated adult residing with another; (2) each related adult, other than spouses, residing with another; (3) each child residing with nonlegally responsible relatives; (4) each child living under the care of unrelated persons; and (5) an emancipated minor.

FY 89-90

California's maximum four-person family income for services eligibility is \$30,281 (80% of the median income for California for a family of four). The median income for FY 89/90 is \$37,852 for a family of four and was calculated by applying the California Necessities Index (CNI) cumulatively to the median income figure provided in the 1981/82 Comprehensive Annual Services Program Plan (CASPP).

1-person family	- (52% of \$30,281)	- \$15,746	- \$1,312 monthly
2-person family	- (68% of \$30,281)	- \$20,591	- \$1,716 monthly
3-person family	- (84% of \$30,281)	- \$25,436	- \$2,120 monthly
4-person family	- (100% of \$30,281)	- \$30,281	- \$2,523 monthly
5-person family	- (116% of \$30,281)	- \$35,126	- \$2,927 monthly
6-person family	- (132% of \$30,281)	- \$39,971	- \$3,331 monthly

For each additional family member above six persons, add three percentage points to the percentage for a family of six.
