SUBJECT: STATISTICAL REPORT ON THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN, AGES 5-17, IN FAMILIES RECEIVING CalWORKs CASH ASSISTANCE ABOVE THE POVERTY LEVEL

This letter is to inform counties about the 2005 process for the collection and reporting of data required by Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965, as amended. The ESEA requires determination of the number of children between the ages of 5 and 17 in families that received CalWORKs cash assistance exceeding the poverty income level for the month of October each year residing in each local educational area (LEA) or county. Because there is no Statewide source for it, County Welfare Departments (CWD) are responsible for providing the information on children in families receiving CalWORKs. The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) will coordinate the correlation of these children to LEA/county. The California Department of Education and the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families (ACF) use the information to allocate federal funds to meet the education needs of disadvantaged children.

This year's process is unchanged from the 2004 procedure. The process is as follows: 1) the requested data is to be sent by the CWD to the CDSS, not the County Office of Education; 2) if there are children in families receiving CalWORKs above poverty level, the data must be sent to CDSS via "double envelope" (see instructions below); 3) the data for children in families receiving CalWORKs cash assistance less than the poverty level is no longer being requested by CDSS.

By December 15, 2005, the CWD must provide to the CDSS, for each child (defined as a person aged 5 through 17 inclusive [i.e., a child who reaches age 5 in the month of October is included, one who reaches age 18 is not]) in a CalWORKs family for which it issues CalWORKs aid payments (cash assistance payments only, vendor payments, assistance in kind, and income from other sources are not considered) above the poverty income level

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(defined by ACF as the level for a family of four, regardless of family size: \$1,612.50) during October 2005, the following information:

- **State ID Number/Case Number** (14 digit number including county number, aid code, serial number, assistance number and child number, i.e., 37-42-0000000-1-11)
- **Street Address** (physical address of child, not P.O. Box)
- **City**
- **Zip Code**
- **County of Residence**
- **Date of Birth**

A form for this purpose, Children Aged 5-17 in Families Receiving CalWORKs Greater Than \$1,612.50 During October 2005 (TEMP 2220 [10/05]), is attached. If there are no such children issued aid by your county, please return the form indicating "None." If there are children in families issued CalWORKs above poverty level by your county, the form must be sent to CDSS using a dual envelope procedure. One envelope must be marked "CONFIDENTIAL" and addressed as indicated below. This envelope must be placed in a second envelope and mailed to CDSS at the same address below. This dual envelope procedure is being implemented to ensure client specific information is processed in a confidential manner.
