SUBJECT: DBP TASK FORCE - MODEL MODULAR COUNTY EDP SYSTEMS

REFERENCE:

A county/state task force is being established with the primary goal of cooperatively developing a Model Modular County EDP System responsive to both county and state requirements.

The basic approach to be used by the task force will be to: (1) describe county and state EDP systems requirements in an integrated package, (2) describe evaluation criteria and evaluate systems existing or under development, and (3) select systems or parts of systems, to be included in the model system.


The Model Modular Systems approach should provide a single system, compatible with state and individual county needs. Furthermore, since the task force approach builds upon current systems, which represent previous federal, state and county investments, it does not "reinvent the wheel", but rather integrates the best parts of current incremental systems in a cost effective manner.
