SUBJECT: FOOD STAMP PROGRAM - POSTAL SERVICE ISSUANCE OF FOOD COUPONS

REFERENCE: ALL-COUNTY LETTER 75-140


Benefit Payments and Food and Nutrition Service, USDA, have approved a revised model interim contract for over the counter issuance in those counties not currently contracting with the Postal Service for issuance.

The new contract differs from the one attached to All-County Letter 75-140. Paragraph 8, Part II has been revised to clarify indemnification and billings; Paragraph 9, Part II has been revised to clearly describe the liability of the Postal Service; Paragraph 2, Part II has been modified to include provision for USPS transporting stamps from their central storage facility to outlets; Paragraph 5, Part II has been revised to clarify that FNS-250 reports will be for Project Areas; and a new Paragraph 10, Part II has been added to include federal nondiscrimination requirements.

Those counties which have been negotiating with the Postal Service (San Bernardino, Tuolumne, Sonoma, Riverside, San Luis Obispo, Ventura, Solano, Napa, Santa Cruz, Santa Barbara, and Placer) will automatically receive copies of the new contract directly from the Postal Service.
