SUBJECT: IMPLEMENTATION OF NEW WIN REGULATIONS


REFERENCE: EAS 41-440 AND 42-600

State regulations implementing the new federal WIN regulations have been adopted by the Department of Benefit Payments and became effective for eligibility purposes on April 1, 1976. Recognizing that lead time is necessary to implement these regulations, the following Quality Control guidelines have been developed with the cooperation of the Employment Development Department.

1. Except as noted in paragraphs 2 and 3, all cases authorized for AFDC after April 1, 1976 must conform to the requirements of the new WIN regulations by July 1, 1976. In addition, all annual redeterminations completed in April, May or June of this year must conform to the new WIN regulations by July 1, 1976. The remainder of the continuing caseload must be brought into compliance with the revised regulations at the time of the annual redetermination.
2. In some cases, the EDD-WIN unit will reevaluate a recipient's appropriateness for WIN prior to the dates specified in the guidelines above. WIN will then either deregister the individual and notify the county welfare department, or contact the county welfare department to determine the WIN eligibility of the registered recipient. When, in either case, the EDD-WIN unit changes a recipient's status, the county welfare department will take appropriate action to update the welfare status of the recipient by the end of the month following the status change.
3. Under the new WIN regulations, CETA and WIN OJT (includes WIN-COD) and PSE and CETA work experience are considered employment for purposes of deprivation and subject to the hundred-hour work rule. Implementation of this regulation shall allow all persons participating in such programs prior to April 1, 1976 to complete their component as originally assigned without affect on AFDC eligibility. However, all persons who begin participation or have participation renewed or extended in these components subsequent to April 1, 1976 will be subject to the regulation as formulated.
