ALL COUNTY FISCAL OFFICERS

SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR 1983-84 STATE FUND ALLOCATION FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF: (1) THE ADOPTION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (AAP) - ELIGIBILITY/ NON-SERVICE (E/NS); (2) STAFF DEVELOPMENT - E/NS; (3) THE NON-MEDICAL OUT-OF-HOME CARE (NMOHC) PROGRAM; AND (4) THE STATE ADULT (SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES) PROGRAM.

Attached is your FY 1983-84 State fund allocation for the administration of the Adoptions Assistance - E/NS, Staff Development - E/NS, Non-Medical Out-of-Home Care, and State Adult Programs.


To provide maximum flexibility, the statewide amounts designated for these programs have been combined. This "block" of funds may be used at the county's discretion to fund eligible expenditures in the aforementioned programs. No funding is included for a cost-of-living adjustment.

The Adoption Assistance portion of this allocation is based on each county's percent of persons receiving AAP grants during the October 1982 through April 1983 period, with a minimum allocation of \$100. This time period was chosen because this is the most recent data available since the implementation of the federal portion of this program. This allocation can be utilized to reimburse the state share of the cost of verifying linkage and payment levels for Adoption Assistance - Title IV-E, and Adoption Assistance - Non-Title IV-E cases.

The Staff Development portion of this allocation is based on a 1:1 ratio of prior expenditures (April 1982 through March 1983) to the eligibility staff for the same period, with a \$300 minimum in the expenditure portion of the allocation computation. The April 1982 through March 1983 time period was chosen because audited expenditures for the April-June 1983 quarter were not available. The state share of Staff Development - AFDC-FG/U, Staff Development - Nonassistance Food Stamps, Staff Development - Emergency Assistance, and Staff Development - AFDC-FC will be charged to this allocation.

The NMOHC and the State Adult portions of the allocation were based on expenditures for April 1982 through March 1983. This time period was chosen because audited expenditures for the April-June 1983 quarter were not available. These programs are 100 percent state-funded. Costs identified as SSI/SSP Out-of-Home Care and State Adult Program will be charged against this allocation.
