SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2010-11 PLANNING ALLOCATION FOR THE
PROMOTING SAFE AND STABLE FAMILIES (PSSF) CASEWORKER
VISITS GRANT (CVG)

The purpose of this letter is to inform counties of the PSSF CVG planning allocation for FY 2010-11. Contingent upon approval of the FY 2010-11 Budget Act, a total of \$2,004,176 federal funds will be made available. The allocation was adjusted to ensure that each county would receive a minimum of \$1,740. Total funds are to be spent by September 30, 2011.

The PSSF grant was established under Title IV-B to provide funding for community-based family support and preservation services to promote better outcomes for children. In keeping with this goal, additional funding has been added to the PSSF grant for the purpose of increasing monthly visits to children in foster care. The federal grant stipulates that funding is to be used only for monthly caseworker visits and for activities to support caseworker retention, recruitment, training, and ability to access the benefits of technology. These funds cannot supplant Title IV-E funds.

The PSSF Caseworker Visits allocation is based on a weighted calculation of hours per visit, cost per hour, and caseload. Funds were then distributed using a percent to statewide total of the following three caseloads: 1) total Foster Family Agency (FFA) and Out-of-State placements monthly visit caseload, 2) total Foster Family Home placement caseload (excluding FFA and Group Home), and 3) average Out-of-County caseload.

The 2010 PSSF CVG and \$2,004,176 federal funds are only available until September 30, 2011. Expenditures claimed on the quarterly expense claims listed below can be charged against this grant.

- September 2010 quarter
- Supplemental September 2010 quarter

- December 2010 quarter
- March 2011 quarter
- June 2011 quarter

During the audit of the June 2010 quarter expense claim, the California Department of Social Services will ensure maximization of the federal grant. The allocation will be capped after the June 2011 quarter is audited. Since supplemental claims for the December 2010 quarter, March 2011 quarter, and June 2011 quarter are not available after September 30, 2011, any costs charged to the PSSF Caseworker Visit Allocation will be shifted utilizing State Use Only (SUO) Codes 684 and 734.

CLAIMING

Costs for eligible activities can be claimed upon receipt of your county's allocation letter. Costs will be funded at 100/00/00/00 (Federal/State/Health/County). Administrative costs associated with Increase Funding for Caseworker Visits can be captured using existing Program Code 677—PSSF Monthly Caseworker Visits. Once a county exceeds their PSSF Caseworker Visits allocation, SUO Code 684 will be utilized to shift the overmatch costs. Since these activities are also eligible Child Welfare Services (CWS) activities, the overmatch amount shifted to SUO Code 684 will be shifted to SUO 734, funded at 50/35/15 (fed/state/county), and tracked against the counties CWS Allocation. The nonfed costs will be shifted to SUO Code 146. Please refer to CFL 09/10-19 for additional claiming instructions.
