TO: ALL FOOD BANK EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS
EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (EFAP) COORDINATORS

SUBJECT: EFAP SUPPLEMENTAL ALLOCATION

The EFAP is pleased to announce that there is supplemental funding available to food banks that had allowable unreimbursed administrative expenses in FFY 2011.

The supplemental funding is comprised of funds set-aside by EFAP for emergency purposes, unspent funds by food banks, and unspent funds re-allocated from other states. The funding is allocated to food banks based on the 60/40 formula; 60 percent of the number of persons in the households within the county having income below the federal poverty level (based on the 2000 census data), and 40 percent of the number of unemployed persons within the county (obtained annually from the Employment Development Department). The total amount of supplemental funding available for FFY 2011 is \$466,103.

Please submit a Supplemental Allocation Request for Reimbursement of Expenses form by mail, not to exceed the amount noted on the attached spreadsheet. The form can be found online at: <http://www.dss.cahwnet.gov/efap/res/pdf/SupplementalReimbursement.pdf>. In order to be processed, the form requires an original signature. Food banks do not need to submit back up documentation to support the unreimbursed amount. The EFAP will supply this documentation on behalf of the food bank. The deadline to submit a claim for reimbursement is July 31, 2012.
