ALL COUNTY FISCAL OFFICERSSUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2000/01 EMANCIPATED YOUTH STIPENDS
ALLOCATION

The purpose of this letter is to provide counties with their FY 2000/01 Emancipated Youth Stipends allocation of \$3.5 million for FY 2000/01. This is a new allocation pursuant to the Budget Act of 2000. This allocation is funded 100% State General Fund (SGF) and requires no county match. This funding is intended to be used by county welfare departments to administer special needs stipends for emancipating foster youth. This program will provide assistance to emancipating foster youth for items such as finding affordable housing, text books for college or vocational training, employment searches, emergency personal needs and bus vouchers. A future All County Letter (ACL) will be sent separately providing program instructions.

Program codes and claiming instructions are being developed and will be issued in a future CFL. Any expenditures exceeding the administrative SGF allocation will be shifted to a county only cost. At year-end closeout, adjustments will be made to cover counties who exceeded their allocations with any statewide surplus available.

Attached is a county by county display of the \$3.5 million which is distributed based upon a percent to statewide total of each county's Foster Care kids ages 18-21 extracted from the Child Welfare Services (CWS)/Case Management System (CMS). Each county is guaranteed a minimum floor of \$1000.
