SUBJECT: PLANNING ALLOCATION FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2002/03 EMANCIPATED YOUTH  
STIPENDS

Contingent upon approval of the State Budget, the amounts identified on the enclosed attachment are your planning allocations for the Emancipated Youth Stipends program. It is anticipated that a total of \$3.6 million in State funds will be made available upon approval of the FY 2002/03 Budget Act.

This planning allocation is funded 100 percent with State General Funds (SGF) and requires no county match. Funds are to be used by county welfare departments to administer special needs stipends for emancipating foster youth and is intended to provide for items such as assistance with finding affordable housing, text books for college or vocational training, employment searches, emergency personal needs and bus vouchers.

Expenditures charged to Program Code 111 will be tracked against this allocation. Administrative expenditures exceeding the SGF allocation will be shifted to a county only cost.

Attached is the county by county distribution of the \$3.6 million based upon a percent to the statewide total of each county's twelve month average of Foster Care kids ages 18-21 extracted from Child Welfare Services/Case Management System for the period of May 2001 through April 2002. Each county is guaranteed a minimum allocation of \$1,000.
