SUBJECT: **REVISED FORMER CALIFORNIA YOUTH AUTHORITY (CYA)
COUNTY CAMP ALLOCATION**

On September 2, 1997, the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) sent the counties CFL No. 97/98-12 which provided claiming instructions and county allocations for the former Emergency Assistance (EA) Probation program and the former CYA State General Fund camp funds now funded under the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANF).


In response to a request from the Chief Probation Officers of California, the purpose of this CFL is to provide the counties with a revised CYA County Camp allocation for Fiscal Year (FY) 1997/98 that is more consistent with the historical methodology of determining the distribution of available funds among the counties. The amount identified in the second column of the attachment is the total county allocation for the first two quarters of the current FY. These funds were disbursed to the counties by CDSS during the period of July 1997 to January 1998. The funds remaining from the \$32.7 million allocation are summarized in the third column of the attachment. CDSS will reallocate the entire \$32.7 million allocation in accordance with quarterly occupied bed count data received from CYA for FY 1997/98. This data is due to CDSS by July 31, 1998 and it is anticipated that the revised allocation will be sent to the counties in August 1998.

When revising an allocation there is both a positive and negative risk factor involved even when taking steps to minimize the fiscal impact to the parties involved. In this instance, after the reallocation process has taken place there is the possibility of some counties receiving additional funds while others may have to repay CDSS for funding received in excess of their revised allocation. To compensate for this unexpected fiscal impact, CDSS will implement the following course of action to minimize the impact to each of the counties.

Beginning with February 1998 through June 1998, CDSS will cease to advance counties funds associated with the FY 1997/98 County Camp allocation of \$32.7 million. Also, during this same time period, CDSS will not pay any county claims associated with this allocation. Implementation of these items will help reduce the fiscal impact to the counties by providing CDSS with funds from the FY 1997/98 County Camps allocation to appropriately increase or decrease each county's allocation in conjunction with the revised FY 1997/98 allocation.

The FY 1997/98 county allocation for the EA Probation program will remain status quo as identified in CFL No. 97/98-12.
